

A FIRST AID KIT FOR YOUR MOTORCYCLE

Do you bring a first aid kit with you when you go for a ride on your motorcycle. If not what do you do when you have or encounter an accident where someone, maybe you need emergency first aid?

It is always a good idea to have a kit with you when you ride.

There are a plethora of prepackaged first aid kits at your local drug stores and auto parts dealers. The internet has a wide variety of kits available in a variety of price ranges.

It is also possible to put your own kit together by shopping at a store like Walmart or your local drug store. A prepackaged kit is nice as it comes with a case to store all the needful items and is quite well thought out. The one I have shown below sells for under \$17.00 and seems to contain most items you might need for roadside emergency first aid repair. There is however one missing item that you should have with you and that is a splint. While it is impossible to carry everything you might need in an emergency you can go to your local Home Depot or Lowes hardware store and get a couple of free wooden paint stirrers to use for an emergency splint.

This kit is perfect for the home or on-the-go. Consider one for your car or truck also.

- (1) Thermometer, one time use
- (2) Latex-free exam-quality vinyl gloves
- (1) Pair of scissors
- (1) Pair of tweezers, plastic
- (1) Zippered clear-pocket soft pack (3) Antibiotic ointment packs
- (4) Antiseptic cleansing wipes (sting free)
- (1) Hydrocortisone pack
- (2) Hand sanitizer packs
- (2) 81 mg chewable aspirin tablets
- (20) 3/4" x 3" Plastic bandages
- (10) 1" x 3" Plastic bandages
- (2) 2" x 4" Elbow and knee plastic bandages
- (5) 3/8" x 1-1/2" Junior plastic bandages
- (1) Knuckle fabric bandage
- (1) Fingertip fabric bandage
- (3) Patch bandages, 1-1/2" x 1-1/2"
- (1) Instant cold compress
- (1) Triangular sling/bandage
- (1) Trauma pad, 5" x 9"
